Fred was Reggie's owner a very long time ago. Then he got too old and stopped coming to see him.


Mabel and Maurice were the harbour cats. They knew all about Fred. They were just a little bit worried so kept an eye on Reggie.

They all spent the next couple of days restoring Reggie to his former glory. Fred would have been very proud.


